We are pleased to announce that we are now accepting applications for the Fall, 2012 CELT Faculty Fellows Seminar, offered through the Center for the Enhancement of Learning and Teaching (CELT).

At Tufts, we pride ourselves on valuing scholarship and research. Even as we advance our research and scholarship, we must continue to strive for excellence in teaching and renew ourselves as educators in light of new research on the process of learning, rapid developments in the fields we teach, changing demographics of our students, and new technologies.

- Brief statement of interest outlining what you hope to gain from this experience
- Any scheduling conflicts for the dates outlined above

Applications will be reviewed at the beginning of April, and we will notify all applicants by the middle of April. There is a small stipend for participating in the Seminar. If you are selected to participate, an email from your department chair expressing approval of your participation will be required.
