

The indirect assessment consists of two parts: (1) opinions expressed about the program by MS recipients in the exit survey for 2010 – 2011, and (2) a list of the current occupations of all students of whom we are aware whose highest degree in our program was an MS. In most cases the current occupations are self reported to the Graduate Alumni Office. The evidence shows that our MS students are well satisfied with their educational experience at the time of their graduation, and go on to pursue successful careers in meaningful occupations after they leave Tufts.

1. Nine MS recipients expressed opinions about our program in the Graduate Exit Survey for 2010 – 11 conducted by the Tufts Office of Institutional Research and Evaluation. All nine expressed general satisfaction with all aspects of the program. The average rating for the quality of the faculty was 4.4 on a scale of 5. The responses to the question of whether they would again enroll in the program were: 4 – definitely, 4 – probably, and 1 – probably not.
